

Merry Christmas everyone! The year 2023 has gone very fast, or so it seems – and we end this year – as all years – celebrating the great feast of the Nativity of our Lord; as Jesus Christ is born into the world!

Like the song says, 'It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year.' Many will gather with family and friends; sometimes traveling several miles; to celebrate the beauty and power of the Incarnation; the Word made flesh; the Son of God and Son of Mary who came into the world for our salvation and redemption.

Throughout history, the prophets proclaimed the coming of a Savior; a light that no darkness could overcome; a light that can transform all human hearts through the power of the Holy Spirit. Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by <u>giving alms</u>; and we practice self-control through <u>fasting</u>. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the <u>Order of Christian Initiation</u> <u>of Adults</u>, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

Bring Forth the Kingdom



In early January of this year, my husband Bill and I returned to Hong Kong. During our visit, we enjoyed quality time with our family and friends in this cosmopolitan city, surrounded by picturesque mountains. One memorable adventure included hiking on section two of the Wilson Trail, where we were captivated by the breathtaking views from the mountaintop.

The highlight of our trip was an experience at my mother church. I had the privilege of playing the organ and conducting the choir, followed by a delightful banquet at a Chinese restaurant. Engaging in joyous conversations and sharing moments with my former church friends, discussing their lives and developments in the church, was heartwarming. These interactions served as a powerful reminder that people around the world are dedicated to spreading the Gospel and expanding God's kingdom.

A chef knows when and how much salt to add to a dish as salt both balances and enhances the flavor of other ingredients. We are "salt for the Kingdom of God" and we should "share the flavor of life" to those around us. It might seem small and insignificant to us, but God would magnify and serve His greater purpose.

Marty Haugen (b. 1950) is a prolific liturgical composer from Minnesota. Raised in an American Lutheran Church, he graduated from Luther College with a degree in Psychology. His first job as a church musician was in a Catholic parish during the time when important liturgical and musical changes occurred after Vatican II. He wrote music appropriate to the liturgy in the Mass while at the same time, studied and eventually graduated with a Master's degree in Pastoral Leadership at University of St. Thomas in St. Paul Minnesota. He is well known for his contribution to Christian music and liturgy, used in both Roman Catholic and Protestant churches.

Haugen writes the text of this hymn which is based on Matthew 5:13-16. It is a hymn that expounds on God's calling each of us to be salt and light in the world (verse one and two). In addition, we are "seed of the Word" (verse three). We are a pilgrim people (verse four) and we are journeying with God to bring forth the Kingdom.

Let everyone of us contribute our unique gift, our salt, to grow and expand the Kingdom of God!



As we begin to prepare for Lent we will focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This 40-day journey, beginning with Ash Wednesday, February 14th and ending with Holy Week.

It is also when CRS (Catholic Relief Services) asks us to help families learn about how our sisters and brothers across the world overcome hardships like hunger and climate change, and how through Lenten alms, we have the power to make the world a better place.

Again we are invited to encounter God and our global family throughout Lent by practicing the pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

This could involve a variety of duties, such as watering existing plants, repotting, setting the space for specific Feast days. Preparing the environment for Lent, Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas just to name a few.

Distribution of Ashes In the past we have distributed ashes when visiting the homebound or particular care centers. We can do this again. Let me know in advance that you will be taking ashes, so I can have them ready for you.

We DO NOT take ashes to the hospital.

When we're not at Mass, sometimes we just need short, simple prayers to remain close to God during our busy days. Lent is no different. Here are some easy prayers you can say to feel connected to God during Lent this year:

OCRES RICE

- "God, may Your light guide my day, and your spirit bring me peace. Amen."
- "Heavenly Father, I'm truly sorry for the moments today where I missed the mark. I ask for your forgiveness and the <u>strength</u> to better follow Your call tomorrow. Amen."
- "God, I lift up (name of the person you'd like to pray for) today. I ask that you bless them abundantly today and throughout Lent. Amen."
- "Oh Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything. Amen."

About War ... Pray For Peace

As our world reels from the shattered places where war and violent conflict rage we are compelled to pray for peace. It may also serve us well to better understand the extent of conflicts today, across the globe. Many sources are readily available on the internet to identify how many armed conflicts are happening today, though the statistics vary widely. For example: "Our Rule of Law in Armed Conflict Online Portal (RULAC) classifies all situations of armed violence as those that amount to an armed conflict under international humanitarian law. Today, it monitors more than 110 armed conflicts.....Some of these conflicts make the headlines, others do not. Some of them started recently, while others have lasted for more than 50 years." (Note: This source gives an overview of the places in the world.) <u>https://geneva-academy.ch/galleries/today-s-armed-conflicts</u>

Another source, wisevoter.com, provides a more conservative, though still alarming, number: "Overall, there are 32 countries currently in conflict, and the types of conflict vary widely. While the severity and duration of these conflicts differ, they all have significant impacts on the affected populations and can result in a high number of casualties as well as humanitarian crises." *This source identifies origins of violent conflict to include terrorist insurgencies (often involves non-state actors, such as extremist groups,) civil wars, drug wars and ethnic violence. (Note: We might add territorial invasion and takeover.)* https://wisevoter.com/country-rankings/countries-currently-at-war/

Where do we even begin to comprehend, let alone pray for all the brokenness in our world? As we continue to look in horror at the wars receiving the most attention – those in Israel and Gaza and in Ukraine – **Pope** Francis' words encompass the larger scope of the horrors of war -- any place and any time.

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

- * We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.
- * Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.
- * Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.
- * Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: *Shalom, Peace, Salaam!*

Last year, he helped launch the Sentinel Project, a private-public partnership between the Montana Department of Justice, Montana Beer and Wine Distributors Association, and the Missoula-based Lifeguard Group to increase human trafficking training and public education in the state.




