### WHAT ARE THE SCRUTINIES?

The Scrutinies are Rites celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, by those people who are preparing to be baptized at Easter, known as "The Elect". They are important and special rites of the Church. Whenever they are celebrated the Scripture readings of Year A of the liturgical cycle are used.

The Scrutinies are described by the Church as "rites for self-searching and repentance, which are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all."

We have 4 elect this year and 1 candidate who has already been baptized.

### Jerusalem, My Destiny

As Jesus embarked on his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, it marked the beginning of his final week of earthly life. Aware of his impending betrayal, crucifixion, and death, he embraced his destiny with unwavering resolve. But do we, in our own lives, possess such clarity of purpose? I often ponder this question for myself. Would it be preferable to have full knowledge of our destiny? Yet, instead of seeking foreknowledge, I find solace in seeking God's will for my life.

The essence of the Lenten season revolves around the church's profound identification with Jesus' death and resurrection, as articulated in Romans 6:1-4. It encapsulates the paradoxical nature of existence.

The Lent spans forty days, a number imbued with symbolic significance throughout the Bible, representing completeness and fulfillment. Consider the forty days and nights of rain during Noah's time, Israel's forty-year journey through the wilderness before entering the promised land, and Jesus' forty-day period of temptation.

The Lenten journey of forty days embodies a baptismal spirituality. Through repentance and a turning away from sin toward Jesus, we embark on a transformative path in our lives, aligning ourselves with God's divine agenda. This journey is not a singular event but a continual process of growth and renewal.

Rory Cooney, born in 1952, composed both the text and music for *Jerusalem, My Destiny*. A dedicated servant of the Church, Cooney's musical contributions have enriched liturgical worship across diverse communities. His commitment to music ministry was recognized with the prestigious "Pastoral Musician of the Year" award in 2014 by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

Jerusalem, My Destiny opens with a refrain, symbolizing our commitment to journey alongside Jesus toward Jerusalem. Each verse carries profound meaning: from acknowledging the call of the one true God to rise, to embracing the journey toward a new land, encountering Jesus as our savior, and finding a renewed vision and hope in him.

Cooney's musical composition skillfully employs text painting, accentuating pivotal words and themes. Notably, the repetition of three notes in the refrain underscores our determination to fix our eyes and set our hearts on Jesus. In the verses, the soaring melody on the word "Here" emphasizes the foundational truths we discover in Christ.

In this Lenten season, we are reminded of our destiny and hope. We journey with Jesus to the cross, confident in the promise of new life found in the Risen Christ. As we reflect on *Jerusalem, My Destiny* and its profound message, may we be inspired to walk faithfully in the footsteps of our Savior, embracing the transformative power of his love.

## Is Loneliness Becoming a National Epidemic?

In 2023 the Surgeon General issued a health advisory declaring loneliness and social isolation a national epidemic. Over 25% of American adults are chronically lonely, while nearly 60% feel lonely more often than not.

The sense of loneliness and social isolation has been increasing for several decades, and was made worse by the pandemic. Loneliness and social isolation can have profound health effects. Studies have shown that chronic loneliness can increase the risk of dying by as much as smoking 15 cigarettes per day.

Join us on Friday, March 15 at 10:30 AM in the Saint Mary social center to discuss how we can help those lonely and isolated in our parish community. Dr. Dave Krainacker will give a short talk on the topic, followed by a discussion on how to help those in need.

- 8 Pray for those most affected by climate change people who suffer from extreme heat and poor air quality.
- 9 Check your coffee, tea –are they Fair Trade? Saint Mary's supports Cafe Mam, a family owned company built on principles of ethical sourcing, environmentalism, human dignity and sustainability. Order your fair trade coffee from them in the gathering space or the office.

Learning to accept our body, to care for it and to respect its fullest meaning, is an essential part of any genuine ecology." (LS155)

- **10 Fourth Sunday of Lent** Take a walk in your neighborhood. Do you know your neighbors? Not just the humans but trees, plants, birds, animals, bodies of water. Meet some you don't know.
- 11 Pray for those most affected by climate change children of future generations who will pay the price of our selfishness today. Do something positive today to create a sustainable world.
- 12 Take a nap; take a walk. Good self-care is part of integral ecology too!
- 13 Give a donation to an environmental organization. For ex. Catholic Climate Covenant.
- 14 Use only cold water and biodegradable detergent for laundry.
- 15 Feast of St. Louise de Marillac who asked on her deathbed, "Take good care of the poor." How do you take good care of our poor Earth?
- 16 Make an act of contrition today for the ways in which you have harmed the earth, our common home.



Saint Mary Catholic Community is participating in the **Because He First Loved Us** Campaign for Catholic Life along with every parish in the Diocese of Helena. This extraordinary effort seeks to raise \$30 million for parishes, including ours, as well as meeting the pressing needs of our Diocese by supporting formation of our seminarians, providing a secure retirement to our retired priests, restoring the Cathedral of St. Helena, and importantly, leading others to discover Christ.

Saint Mary Catholic Community's goal is \$838,000. Of this amount, 40% will remain at our parish for for the following needs:

#### **Faith Formation and Outreach**

Twenty percent of our campaign funds will be used to support our Faith Formation ministries and develop new strategies and tools for additional outreach to our local Helena community. These funds will be used to strengthen the OCIA program, RE program, sacramental preparation, and growing families in our faith. Our future generations are the source of our priests, religious and lay ministries and our response to Christ's call to "go out into all the world and spread the Good News!"

### **Endowment for Future Needs**

Twenty percent of our campaign funds will be placed in our parish endowment account to provide for our generations of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great grandchildren.

### **Capital Projects: Parking Lot Reconstruction and Other Urgent Needs**

Saint Mary Catholic Community has a beautiful expansive campus. However, the parking lot has been in need of full rehabilitation for a number of years and regular maintenance will no longer suffice. A reconstruction of our parking lot ensures that Saint Mary can safely accommodate parishioners, visitors, and staff now and into the future. Sixty percent of funds raised In this campaign will become the seed monies for the parish's urgent capital needs

If Saint Mary Catholic Community reaches the \$838,000 goal, everything raised after that will then be flipped, where Saint Mary will receive 60% of the funds raised and the Diocese will receive 40%.

We are grateful for the ongoing commitment of our parish community.
