WHAT IS CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD?

CGS is a Montessori-based Catholic faith formation program where children can grow in their relationship with God through a deep engagement in Scripture and liturgy. CGS is based on the belief that God and the child are already in relationship. Our work as adults is to provide a place for the child and God to come together and grow.

HISTORY

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based religious formation program for children, beginning at the age of three. It seeks to create and facilitate a sacred, "hands-on" space for children called an atrium, in which both the children and their catechists can hear, ponder, and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Catholic faith as revealed in the Scriptures and the Liturgy. Originally developed in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi fifty years ago, the Catechesis continues to spread world-wide.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) AT ST. MARY CATHOLIC COMMUNITY

We applied for a grant from Catholic Extension in order to start CGS at St. Mary. The grant will be up to \$15,000. Part of the requirement of the grant is that there will be a meeting with a representative from Catholic Extension on Wednesday, April 3rd at 6pm in the Social Center. Catholic Extension wants to hear from parishioners of all ages and see how much support the parish will give this catechesis.

In CGS, the children meet in the atrium, which is a specially prepared room where children can come to know Jesus, the Good Shepherd. The atrium is prepared with materials that children work with as a way of meditating upon the essentials of our faith found in Scripture and in liturgy. We will need help with making materials for the atrium!

Please join us at the meeting to find out more information about CGS! This will be life giving for our children and our whole parish!

***CONDITIONAL BAPTISM** The rite of baptism performed on a person who is entering the Roman Catholic Church and is not certain about previous baptism. This is not rebaptism, which is impossible, since this sacrament can be received only once.

Liturgical Life

O Sons and Daughters

"O Sons and Daughters" is a beloved hymn, capturing the essence of Easter joy and the triumph of Christ's resurrection. Dating back to the 15th century, "O Sons and Daughters" originated as a French Easter hymn titled "O Filii et Filiae." Its authorship is attributed to Jean Tisserand (d. 1497), a Franciscan friar. There are several translations into English verse, and the most notable is the one translated by John Mason Neale (1818-1866).

The lyrics of "O Sons and Daughters" recount the biblical accounts of Christ's resurrection appearances, drawing from passages such as Luke 24 and John 20. Each verse paints a vivid picture of the disciples' encounters with the risen Christ, from Mary Magdalene's encounter at the empty tomb to the disciples' disbelief turned to awe as Jesus appears among them. These verses encapsulate the transformative power of Christ's resurrection, turning sorrow into joy and sadness into gladness. It invites us to embrace the reality of Christ's victory over death and to rejoice in the promise of new resurrected life found in Christ.

The refrain begins and ends with a three-fold Alleluia. Set to the tune O FILII ET FILIAE, this hymn captivates our hearts with its profound message and invites all to join in the celebration.

Let us join with generations past and present in proclaiming the good news of Easter:

"O sons and daughters, let us sing! The King of heav'n, the glorious King, O'er death today rose triumphing. Alleluia!"

Our Saint Mary Catholic Community is united at the core in our faith and as beloved children of God. We are also wonderfully diverse in our cultural heritages, some of our ideas, and in the unique gifts God has given to each one of us. Hospitality is important to us. We strive to be a welcoming community that values, as Jesus does, all who come through our doors. We want everyone who enters to find a spiritual home and a place in our community. Each person enriches our community in a unique way that no one else can. As we connect with and come to know each other better, we strengthen our community which is the body of Christ.

Saint Mary Catholic Community has honored and celebrated the diverse cultures in our community over the years in many ways. For example, we once had a tradition of multiethnic dinners at Epiphany. **Father Richard Francesco** made Italian dinners for us. Last December, **Adam Mendez** and his family cooked an excellent Mexican dinner as we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

To continue and expand on this tradition, a concerted effort is underway to honor and celebrate, with food, art and music, the various cultural heritages that make up the Saint Mary community. For several weeks, beginning on April 17, there will be a special place in the gathering space to pray, celebrate and learn about Saint Kateri Tekakwitha and Native American culture. The Saint Mary quilting group is making a star quilt for this place and Charlotte Kelley is providing a statue of Saint Kateri and information about her and those who have a special devotion to her. A piece of music written for her will be included in the Sunday mass on April 13-14. Her place in the gathering space will be blessed in a special ceremony at Mass on Wednesday April 17.

Saint Kateri, informally known as Lily of the Mohawks because of her chastity, is the first Native American woman to become a saint. She led a holy, inspiring, courageous life. She is known for her steadfast devotion to Jesus. She took the name Kateri, which is Mohawk for Catherine of Sienna. At least two healing miracles are attributed to her. She was canonized by Pope Benedict in 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans. She died on April 17, 1680. Her Feast Day is July 14.

Around the country there are four national shrines, numerous statues and many schools, parishes and other Catholic Institutions named after Saint Kateri. She has a huge following in the United States and is of particular importance to Native Americans. The Tekakwitha Conference meets annually. People gather in Kateri Circles to pray, seeking to become better Catholics.

This space will also be available to other cultures to use for temporary exhibits to feature their traditions and special saints.

Mother Mary Paul is with the Sisters of Divine Grace, Their desire is to make known to the world the healing Love of


