From Father Tim

Happy Easter everyone! May the peace of the risen Lord be with you and all of your families. This weekend, we celebrate the greatest Feast of all-time, as Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Death has no power over Him or over us who follow the Lord with all of our hearts!

During this Lenten season, we have been preparing for this wonderful moment through fasting and reflecting on the Lord's love and mercy, just as Christ went into the desert to prepare for His public ministry, to fast for forty days and be tempted by the devil. Later, Christ is Transfigured before Peter, James, and John to illustrate the beauty of heaven that awaits them~ as long as the Apostles— and all of us— are willing to take up our crosses on this earthly journey.

The parable of the fig tree illustrates God's patience, but also the urgency of conversion or turning back to the Lord, because we do not know the time nor the hour when the Lord will call us from this life. The Lord also emphasizes that we HAVE to love one another, because love comes from God. That love is instilled in all of our hearts, and LOVE NEVER FAILS. Christ tells us that true freedom comes from Him, and not from the law. Jesus Christ came to fulfill the law and the prophets, because He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, and the one and only way to salvation.

Then we celebrated Palm Sunday: the Passion of our Lord, as Christ enters Jerusalem to a hero's welcome, only to be brutally beaten and die on the Cross a few days later for not denying He was God.

And now we celebrate Easter Sunday; the holy of holies, and the greatest day in the history of the world! Jesus Christ is risen from the dead through the power of the Holy Spirit, and the world is changed forever. He told His disciples about His upcoming resurrection, but they did not understand—and we would not have understood either. But in 2025, WE KNOW AND WE BELIEVE, because the Apostles were firsthand witnesses to His miracles, His preaching, and His death and resurrection. And they proclaimed this message to the whole world—that JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN FROM THE DEAD!!

This is THE DAY that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad! May the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ transform our hearts and lead us to everlasting life!

Liturgical Life

Alleluia! Let the Holy Anthem Rise

The Easter Vigil is the high point of our liturgical year—a night filled with beauty, and joy. I remember standing outside the church, gathered with the community around the Easter fire, as we began the Service of Light. Then, inside the darkened church, Deacon Michael's voice rang out as he chanted, "Christ our Light," and our attention turned toward the Paschal candle—a powerful symbol of the crucified and risen Christ. During the Liturgy of the Word, we listened once again to the great story of our salvation, and we celebrated all that God has done for us.

This year, we are blessed to welcome Zachary Banks, our catechumen and Devlin Simon, who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation into full communion with the Catholic Church. They have walked a journey of faith and formation, and now they rise with Christ through the waters of Baptism. As a parish family, we rejoice with them and pray for them, for in Christ, we are one Body—"Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it" (1 Cor 12:27).

This sacred night resounds with the triumphant hymn, "Alleluia! Alleluia! Let the Holy Anthem Rise." Its verses invite all of creation to join the song of Easter:

"Let the holy anthem rise, and the choirs of heaven chant it in the temple of the skies! Let the mountains skip with gladness and the joyful valleys ring with hosannas in the highest to our Savior and our King!"

This is the heart of Easter. Christ is risen, and we are invited to rise with Him—now and forever.

The Easter Vigil reminds us that we are one Body in Christ. As we lift our voices in song, may we embrace our mission as a people transformed by Resurrection—called to witness, to serve.

Alleluia! Alleluia! Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

Divine Mercy Sunday — April 27th

A Personal Testimony of Hope

After our son Will died, my husband and I began praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet day and night. It became our anchor in those painful first weeks. Months later, I prayed a novena to St. Faustina, asking that she would intercede for and accompany our son at the moment of his death, and that he had the grace to hope and trust in the infinite love of Jesus.

Just minutes after finishing the final prayer, a friend arrived at our door with a miraculous medal touched to the relics of St. Faustina — and Mass had been offered for our son in the Chapel of Divine Mercy in Poland. A profound signal grace that gave us immense peace.

This Divine Mercy Sunday, I invite you to receive — or offer — the plenary indulgence Jesus promised through St. Faustina. You can receive this grace for yourself or offer it for a loved one who has died.

As Fr. Chris Alar explains, it requires:

- Confession (within 20 days)
- Communion (on Divine Mercy Sunday)
- Prayer for the Pope's intentions
- Detachment from sin
- Participating in Divine Mercy devotions (prayers before the Blessed Sacrament)

A plenary indulgence is a powerful spiritual gift — the full remission of the temporal punishment of sin. What a gift of mercy from the Heart of Christ!

Christ is risen, Alleluia! The somber, solemn introspection of Lent is behind

US! What do we do with this gift, this sublime awareness that Christ has overcome death?

It is tempting to bask in the warm glow of this profound fact and belief of our faith. Indeed, we all need to take a deep breath, savor the joy of this realization and let go of some of our darkest fears. After all, Jesus is with us! Christ is risen! He has overcome death!

Easter as a new beginning may be a wonderful time to initiate a reset in one aspect of our faith journey – our awareness of and engagement with Catholic Social Teachings. Why Easter? Perhaps because we have been strengthened by our Lenten journey and because, with our darkest fears in the hands of the Risen Christ, we can go forward with more energy and positivity. This is not the darkness of Lent, this is the spring of new life!

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops lists seven themes of Catholic Social Teaching. Examining these with renewed appreciation, we may consider them in our own life and actions.

Life and Dignity of the Human Person

"We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person." USCCB*

Call to Family, Community and Participation

"The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society -- in economics and politics, in law and policy -- directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community."

USCCB

Rights and Responsibilities

"... Every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency.

Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities--to one another, to our families, and to the larger society." USCCB

Option For the Poor and Vulnerable

"A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring in a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor..." USCCB

Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The <u>economy must serve people</u>, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. *USCCB*

Solidarity

"We are one human family... Loving our neighbor has global dimensions in a shrinking world. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace." USCCB

Care For God's Creation

"We show our respect for the Creator by our <u>stewardship of creation</u>. Care for the earth ...is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation." USCCB

With the joy and renewal of Easter let us consider the multiple ways we can engage, with positivity and hopefulness, in these faith mandates. *Indeed! An Easter Reset!*

The Power of Symbol in Liturgical Theology: The Meaning of Water and the Baptismal Font

In the life of the Church, symbols are not mere decorations—they are living signs that make present the mysteries they represent. The liturgy is about our faith, which is beyond immediate experience. In liturgical theology, a symbol is more than a visual aid; it is a means by which God communicates His grace and invites us into His divine life.

Symbols, like water, light, and bread are ordinary things which have a deeper meaning. Among the most profound symbols in our worship is water, especially as it is encountered in the baptismal font. Water has a rich biblical and sacramental significance. From the waters of creation (Genesis 1:2) to the great flood (Genesis 7), from the parting of the Red Sea (Exodus 14) to Christ's baptism in the Jordan (Matthew 3:13-17), water has always been a sign of both life and transformation. In the sacrament of Baptism, the baptismal font becomes the sacred place where new life begins. Through the waters of Baptism, we die to sin and are baptized into Christ, becoming members of His Body, the Church (Romans 6:3-4; 1 Corinthians 12:13).

The baptismal font, therefore, is not just a basin of water; it is a powerful sign of God's saving action. We are born anew, and through baptism, we are washed clean from the effects of original sin. Every time we bless ourselves with Holy Water upon entering the church, we recall our own Baptism and our identity as God's children. Liturgical symbols, like water, are meant to draw us deeper into the mystery of faith. They engage our senses, helping us experience God's presence. As we enter into church and see the baptismal font, may we be reminded of God's call to us to live as disciples of Christ, always renewed by the life giving waters of His grace.






