## From Father Tim

Reflection – May 8, 2024

In the Gospel of John (16: 5-11), for Tuesday of the 6th week of Easter, the Lord is preparing His disciples for His Ascension back to the Father, and the disciples are grieving. They have witnessed His miracles; His powerful preaching that the kingdom of God is in their midst, and in their hearts. They have witnessed His passion and death at the hands of the Jewish leaders and Roman soldiers because He simply proclaimed the truth; that He is the Son of God who came for all of us. And they have witnessed the power of the Resurrection to the world; destroying death forever. They have seen Him in His glorified body, and now the time has come for the Lord to go back to His heavenly Father; to be crowned King of Kings and Lord of Lords, and to be seated at the right hand of the Father.

But again, the disciples are grieving. They will miss the One who changed their life forever; who taught them of the eternal world to come; the world of permanent peace and love; united once again with our loved ones, and the place where every tear will be wiped away FOREVER.

But the Lord has to leave them for a time. "It is much better for you that I go. If I fail to go, the Paraclete will never come to you..." The disciples are trying to understand what He is saying, but they will know very soon, as the Holy Spirit will come upon them at Pentecost; filling them with the power and strength to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of Man, to the world – changing salvation history forever.

Many times in our lives we wonder what God's plan is for us as we struggle through moments of sorrow, illness or grief. And yet we know in the depths of our hearts that God's plan is the best plan for all of us as we walk humbly with our God. May the fire of the Holy Spirit guide us and protect us on our earthly journey as we share in His paschal mystery as we keep our vision on Him; the vision of love that will never disappoint.



# Liturgical Life

Jesus our Risen Lord, Hear our Prayer

I was amazed by the grandeur of the Montana State Capitol Rotunda when I entered the building for the very first time last week. A congregation of nearly a hundred people gathered on May 2, 2024 to participate in the 73rd Annual National Day of Prayer. With hearts intertwined in hope and reverence, attendees embraced the theme "Lift Up the Word - Light Up the World" with a fervor that transcended the confines of the Rotunda.

As the echoes of songs resonated inside the Rotunda, there was a meaningful moment that underscored the essence of this sacred gathering—a small group prayer time.

Guided by leaders who fervently petitioned for unity across five pivotal areas, the congregation found solace in scripture and shared reflections, their collective supplications reaching towards the heavens. The small groups, each comprising three or four individuals, prayed earnestly for families, workplaces, communities, cities, local government, military, all people in America.

It was a profound experience for me to be able to pray with other people who equally believe in the powerful effect of communal prayer.

Throughout the Easter season, we are singing the refrain, "Jesus our Risen Lord, Hear our Prayer," resonating through our intercessions. In a world marred by strife and discord, communal prayer emerges as a luminous beacon, offering hope and guiding us toward reconciliation.

The significance of these prayers transcends the physical boundaries of our church walls as well; they encapsulate a shared commitment to advocate for our nation and its people. Beyond mere words, they symbolize a collective plea for healing and harmony in a fractured world.

## Signs of Caregiver Stress—Part 2

As a caregiver, you may be so focused on your loved one that you don't see how caregiving affects your own health and well-being. The signs of caregiver stress include:

- Feeling burdened or worrying all the time.
  - Feeling tired often.
  - Sleeping too much or not enough.
    - Gaining or losing weight.
  - Becoming easily irritated or angry.
- Losing interest in activities you used to enjoy.
  - Feeling sad.
- Having frequent headaches or other pains or health problems.
- Misusing alcohol or drugs, including prescription medicines.
  - Missing your own medical appointments.

Too much stress over time can harm your health. As a caregiver, you might feel depressed or anxious. You might not get enough sleep or physical activity. Or you might not eat a balanced diet. All of these increase your risk of health conditions, such as heart disease and diabetes.

"Lord God, we lift up all mothers to You. Grant them the strength to face the daily challenges with courage and the wisdom to guide their children towards a life of faith and service. Encourage them when they are weary and inspire them when they feel overwhelmed. Bless them with Your peace and love, now and forever. Amen."

## May is Arthritis Awareness Month

Arthritis is very common but is not well understood. Actually ,"arthritis" is not a single disease; it is an informal way of referring to joint pain or joint disease. There are more than 100 different types of arthritis and related conditions. People of all ages, sexes and races can and do have arthritis, and it is the leading cause of disability in America. More than 50 million adults and 300,000 children have some type of arthritis. It is most common among women and occurs more frequently as people get older.

Common arthritis joint symptoms include swelling, pain, stiffness and decreased range of motion. Symptoms may come and go. They can be mild, moderate or severe. They may have-chronic pain, inability to do daily activities and make it difficult to walk or climb stairs. Arthritis can cause permanent joint changes. These changes may be visible, such as knobby finger joints, but often the damage can only be seen on X-ray. Some types of arthritis also affect the heart, eyes, lungs, kidneys and skin as well as the joints.

## Protecting Montana for Future Generations

In March of 2020, just as the country began to shut down due to the Covid 19 pandemic, 16 Montanans ranging in age from 2 to 18 years old filed a groundbreaking lawsuit, Held

v. State of Montana. They sued the state for violating their inalienable right to "a clean and healthy environment." This right is guaranteed to them, and to all current and future Montanans, in our state constitution which is among the most progressive in the nation. The Montana State Constitution also says that the state and each person shall maintain and improve the land and the environment for future generations. The plaintiffs claimed that the Montana Environmental Policy Act was in violation of the state constitution because consideration of climate change was an exception in the Environmental Impact Statement process. The case was filed by the Western Environmental Law Center as a part of Our Children's Trust which is also helping youth in many states protect their environmental rights.

With **incredible courage and dedication**, the young people navigated the legal processes necessary to bring a case to trial. In June of 2023, the case was heard in the 1<sup>st</sup> Judicial District in Lewis and Clark County by Honorable Kathy Seeley. The **young plaintiffs told their heartfelt stories of the harm caused to them by climate change impacts** including the increasing frequency and intensity of hot, smokey summers, shortened winters with less snow, and flooding. They described respiratory illnesses, the impact on family ranch land, depression related to the inability to be outside and to pursue outdoor athletics, anxiety about their health and life as the planet warms, and the difficulty of conducting Native American cultural practices that depend on environmental conditions such as enough snow. One of the girls showed her artwork which expressed the angst she is experiencing.

The testimony of the plaintiffs was supported by numerous scientists, including Nobel Prize winner Steve Running, Ph.D., testifying to the increasing intensity of the climate crisis globally and in the state of Montana. Montana is warming faster than the global average. Glaciers in Glacier National Park and around the state are shrinking significantly each year. Streams are warming, threatening our fisheries. Children are not mini adults, and their health is disproportionately harmed by pollution and climate change. Montana's contribution to climate change is disproportionately large for our population because, for political and social reasons, we continue to mine and use fossil fuels instead of prioritizing renewable energy resources.

Judge Seeley issued a detailed, strong decision in favor of the youth plaintiffs. This ruling has the potential to positively impact the environment and mitigation of the climate crisis in Montana and to facilitate the success of cases of this type in other states. However, the ruling was appealed by the state of Montana. The Montana Supreme Court is expected to rule on the case later this summer.

Many thanks to the youth plaintiffs, their families, and the professionals and community members who supported them for their courageous effort to protect our environment now and for future generations. Just as they strengthen and enrich our society.



## A Letter from the Catholic Bishops of Montana on the Abortion Amendment Constitutional Initiative (CI-128)

Dear People of God,

As Catholics, we treasure life as a precious gift from God and recognize our sacred duty to nurture and protect every human life from the moment of conception through natural death. Created in the image of God with a dignity not of our own making, each person is a unique and unrepeatable masterpiece of God's creation. This recognition of the infinite dignity enjoyed by all persons informs our understanding of the basic rights and protections to which all human beings are entitled. When those rights are threatened, the Church must speak up with clarity and boldness.

At this very moment, there is a coordinated effort underway to gather signatures to place an extreme amendment to our State's constitution on the November ballot. Constitutional Initiative 128 (CI-128) would greatly expand the practice of legalized abortion in Montana abolishing the limited restrictions currently in place and opening the door to a host of practices that violate fundamental rights to life and dignity.

CI-128 is being promoted simply as a protection for women's rights, when in fact, this initiative seeks to enshrine legal authorization for the following:

- Late-term abortion of babies who will feel pain
- · Abortion of babies who have been partially delivered
- Abortion by dismemberment of children growing in the womb

Moreover, this proposal would eliminate current parental notification requirements that apply when minors obtain an abortion. This would:

- · Impose a culture of secrecy that would undermine families
- Expose underage mothers to exploitation
- Provide cover for those who would victimize underage women by committing abuse, human trafficking, and other crimes

Faced with this unprecedented threat to human life, we urge all people of goodwill to decline to sign the petition to place this dangerous amendment on our ballot. Trusting in God, we invite all Montanans to pray for the defeat of this Constitutional Initiative and stand in defense of women, children and all those threatened by this extreme proposal.

May Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Unborn, pray for us. In Christ.
