“Beloved, the days which passed between the Lord’s resurrection and his ascension were by no means uneventful; during them great sacramental mysteries were confirmed, truths revealed. In those days the fear of death with all its horrors was taken away, and the immortality of both body and soul affirmed. It was then that the Lord breathed on all his apostles and filled them with the Holy Spirit; and after giving the keys of the kingdom to blessed Peter, whom He had chosen and set above the others, he entrusted him with the care of his flock...

Throughout the whole period between the resurrection and ascension, God’s providence was at work to instill this one lesson into the hearts of the disciples, to set this one truth before their eyes, that our Lord Jesus Christ, who was truly born, truly suffered and truly died, would be recognized as truly risen from the dead. The blessed apostles, together with all the others, had been intimidated by the catastrophe of the cross, and their faith in the resurrection had been uncertain; but now they were so strengthened by the evident truth that when the Lord ascended into heaven, far from feeling any sadness, they were filled with great joy.”

The apostles and the disciples witnessed several miracles during the time of Christ on earth. Now it was their duty— and our duty 2025 years later—to bring the Gospel message of Jesus Christ to the world. May the same Holy Spirit who guided the Apostles be with us in bringing Christ to the world; one soul at a time.

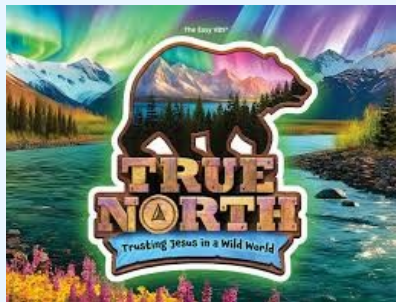

Pastoral Care

In the Gospel of John, Jesus prays:

“Holy Father, I pray...that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you...that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me.” (Jn 17)

Jesus desires our unity—and he tells us it’s possible. This union happens in, with, and through Him: through prayer, study, and especially the Sacraments.

One major obstacle today is family estrangement. A troubling trend is labeling others as “toxic.” Every person is made in God’s image. This label wounds and divides.

If we trust Jesus, we believe the Father’s love is in us and we are growing in His likeness. Mercy sometimes means speaking hard truths, other times it means bearing wrongs patiently. We can’t discern this rightly without Him. Boundaries can be holy when made with charity. Walling-off and name-calling are not.

Peter Kreeft writes in *Food for the Soul*, “If everyone in the orchestra obeys the baton of the conductor, they will play in harmony.”

We each have a part to play. What instrument are you in His orchestra?

Care For Creation and Saint Francis Peace Through Justice Ministries

Laudato Si' Mi Signore Praise be to you, my Lord

On Sunday, May 18, we celebrated with great hope and joy, the 10th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si', On Care For Our Common Home. This celebration was especially meaningful because a panel of Saint Mary parishioners, all equally inspiring and passionate about their calling to care for the earth, shared with us their commitment to living the mission of Laudato Si' in the ways they are able with the gifts they have been given.

Sandi Ashley began the presentation with the beautiful words of Pope Francis, "A Prayer for our Earth." In a moving tribute to the native peoples who inhabited these Montana lands long before they were explored by European settlers, she reminded us that their traditions, culture and philosophy have much to teach us, perhaps even more so in these days, about protecting and caring for creation. Their spirituality and love for the earth have been the embodiment of Laudato Si' long before the encyclical was written and became a part of our Catholic social teaching.

As an introduction to Laudato Si', Sandi described it as a book of praise and love; love for our Creator God and love for our neighbors, human and non-human, ancestors and descendants, both a spiritual call and a worldly call as we prayerfully seek to develop sustainable lifestyles. Each of the four speakers we heard Sunday morning are a testament to the the response of this call. Each speaker showed us what a true commitment to ecological conversion looks like and how it could be possible in our own lives.

LAUDATO SI', TEN YEARS LATER

The first speaker, Phyllis Dorrington, is the coordinator of the Saint Mary Care for Creation Ministry, as well as a founding member of Helena Interfaith Climate Advocates and a member of its steering committee. She started her presentation with a short video of Pope Francis' heartfelt plea to all people of good will to hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.

Phyllis related how reading Laudato Si' nearly ten years ago began for her the process of taking to heart the words of Pope Francis, **"Because all creatures are connected, each must be cherished with love and respect, for all of us as living creatures are dependent on one another,"**. The Pope adds, **"Our relationship with the environment can never be isolated from our relationship with others and with God."** (LS) and for Phyllis, these ideas have become a cornerstone of her work within our parish and community, sharing both Laudato Si' and her love of our common home with all people of good will.
