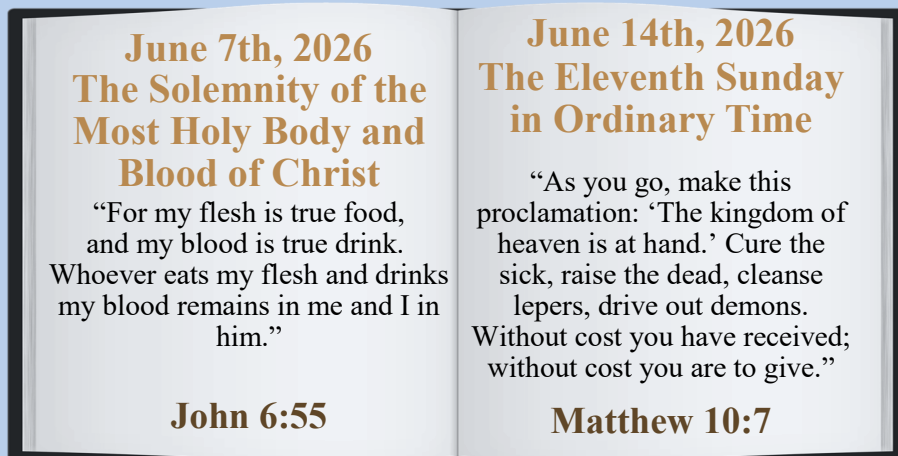

From Father Tim

“Beloved, the days which passed between the Lord’s resurrection and his ascension were by no means uneventful; during them great sacramental mysteries were confirmed, truths revealed. In those days the fear of death with all its horrors was taken away, and the immortality of both body and soul affirmed. It was then that the Lord breathed on all his apostles and filled them with the Holy Spirit; and after giving the keys of the kingdom to blessed Peter, whom He had chosen and set above the others, he entrusted him with the care of his flock...

Throughout the whole period between the resurrection and ascension, God’s providence was at work to instill this one lesson into the hearts of the disciples, to set this one truth before their eyes, that our Lord Jesus Christ, who was truly born, truly suffered and truly died, would be recognized as truly risen from the dead. The blessed apostles, together with all the others, had been intimidated by the catastrophe of the cross, and their faith in the resurrection had been uncertain; but now they were so strengthened by the evident truth that when the Lord ascended into heaven, far from feeling any sadness, they were filled with great joy.”

The apostles and the disciples witnessed several miracles during the time of Christ on earth. Now it was their duty— and our duty 2026 years later—to bring the Gospel message of Jesus Christ to the world. May the same Holy Spirit who guided the Apostles be with us in bringing Christ to the world; one soul at a time.

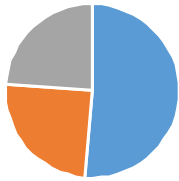

Synopsis of May Pastoral Council Meeting

Pastoral Council members met on Tuesday, May 26th. Father Tim said that his last weekend is July 4th/5th. He thanked the Council for the help they have given over the past four years. There was a discussion concerning social media for the parish, where to use it and what to put on it. Lacey Galen has looked into various possibilities, Facebook being one. The purpose would be to show the personality of the parish. QR codes were discussed, but as with social media, it was put on hold until Father Cody is in place. There was a short discussion concerning altar servers. They have been placed on the schedule and there will be a sign-up at the fall Ministry Fair. There was a discussion concerning new youth representatives to replace the two going off. There was also a discussion concerning new pastoral council members to replace the three going off. Thank you to Ed Glowienka, John Larson and Casey Molloy for the years they have given to the Council. It was decided that in June there will be a bulletin announcement concerning new members and asking parish members to discern whether they would like to be a part of Pastoral Council. There will be a sign-up sheet with a Pastoral Council member present to answer any questions in June.

Pastoral Council Openings

- The Pastoral Council is made up of 8 to 12 parishioners and is the primary consultative group to the Pastor. This is a very valuable ministry for Saint Mary
- The Pastoral Council will have three vacancies that need to be filled by September of this year, for a three-year term.
- The council meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 5:30.
- Meetings are held in September, October, November, January, February, March, April and May.
- A current member of the Pastoral Council will be in the foyer following Mass to share information and answer questions, or feel free to call or talk to any of the current council members listed in this bulletin.
- Anyone interested is asked to sign the sheet in the foyer, and a council member will contact you to follow-up.
- A full discernment process will be implemented for those interested, with Father Cody.

Hospital Communion Ministry

With concern for your privacy, should you be admitted to St. Peter's Health, you will be invited to disclose your religious affiliation and your interest in having a member of Saint Mary Catholic Community contact you during your hospital stay. If you'd like to receive Communion from a Pastoral Care Minister or Father Tim Moriarty, it is important that you answer the questions that enable the hospital Chaplain to contact Saint Mary for you. The nurse completing your intake will ask if you'd like to visit with the Chaplain, Kim Pepper (a member of Our Lady of the Valley Parish), or disclose your religious affiliation and will then inquire if you'd like someone from your faith community to visit you. The Pastoral Care Ministry of Saint Mary Catholic Community would love to provide you with comfort during your hospital stay.

Please let the hospital staff know if a visit would be helpful for you.

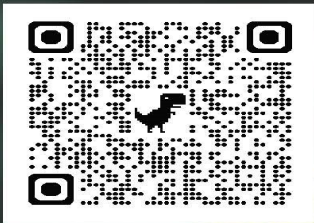

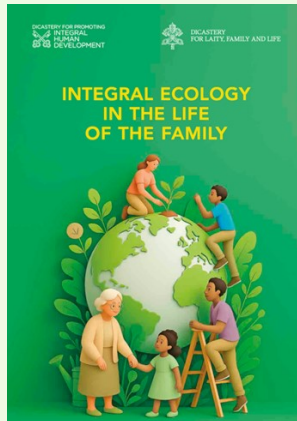

Prayer for Trafficking Victims

*Oh Lord, no person chooses to be exploited.
No child chooses to be abused. Help us to be the rescuers –
shining Your divine light into the darkest corners of our world;
giving hope to victims of human trafficking; speaking out to defend their
dignity; ending this crime against humanity. Emboldened by the Charity of
Christ, we raise our voices in prayer, faithful that one day, through our efforts,
every person will be free to defend their destiny. Amen.*

Human Trafficking is the recruitment, transfer, harboring, or receipt of people through force, fraud or deception with the intent to exploit them for profit.

Exploitation involves forced labor, sexual exploitation, slavery or forced drug trafficking. Victims and sometimes their families are threatened, tortured, brainwashed, manipulated, and/or drugged. Children and teens who are runaways, unhoused or in abusive families are at higher risk, as are immigrants, refugees, Native Americans, and vulnerable adults. In the Helena area an estimated 400 youth are unhoused. Cartels are actively trafficking people - and Interstate 15 and Interstate 90 are among the corridors they utilize. Traffickers also recruit people online.

Signs that a person may be experiencing trafficking include a person who:

- < Displays nervous, anxious, or submissive behavior or apparent sadness
- < Seems disoriented or not aware of location and time
- < Appears to be monitored by another person when talking or interacting with others
- < Does not have control of their money, identification, passport or other personal items

Sheriff Dutton stressed the power of prayer and encouraged us to pray for the victims and for the solicitors. *He noted that often victims of trafficking do not trust law enforcement and may be more trusting of someone from another organization like a church.* The Catholic church's VIRTUS safe environment program has extensive information on signs and symptoms of abuse and appropriate actions to take. If you **notice a person who shows signs of being trafficked, call 911 and local law enforcement will do a welfare check.** They are trained in ways to compassionately and carefully assist vulnerable people in need. The **National Human Trafficking Hotline number is 888-373-7888.**

The World Day of Prayer, Reflection, and Action Against Human Trafficking is February 8, the Feast Day of Saint Josephine Bakhita the patron saint of victims of human trafficking and modern slavery.
